What: Classes for Refugee Women

Where: South Burnaby

How long: This a 12 week pilot program. Classes will run 3 days a week for 2 hours.

PIRS is a not-for-profit organization that provides programs for refugee and immigrant women and their preschool children. We are looking for an EAL teacher with demonstrated experience teaching EAL to vulnerable populations. This position includes 20 hours of curriculum development and 1 hour of preparation time for each 2 hour class.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Ability to communicate fluently and accurately in both written and oral English.
- Develop curriculum for a 12 week program.
- Demonstrated ability to deal empathetically and courteously with students and support staff from diverse backgrounds.
- Ability to accommodate multi-barriered students particularly students who have experienced trauma.
- Familiar with responsive curriculum, learning resources, methodology and community resources to support the women in the program
- Strong critical thinking skills and attention to detail.
- Demonstrated ability to prioritize, organize and complete tasks with minimal supervision.
- Ability to set and maintain boundaries with staff and students and manage self-care.
- Ability to carry out the duties of the position
- Participate in a team approach to program planning and delivery.

Training and experience teaching English as an Additional Language to adults;

Curriculum development;

Familiarity working with multi-barriered populations;

Familiarity with resources and organizations that support refugees;

Ability to work in a team setting;

Ability to work with and direct volunteers;

Attitudes and values in keeping with the goals and philosophies of PIRS.
