



EAL Curriculum Developer and Trainer

The Curriculum Developer and Trainer position at PIRS is an exciting and new opportunity for the successful candidate to create a curriculum resource and train-the-trainer series of workshops for digital literacy learners. We are seeking an innovative curriculum developer and trainer for approximately 18 hours per week on a flexible schedule. The successful candidate will draw on research expertise and use the existing networks in community to develop and deliver comprehensive digital literacy skills to multi-barrier learners. This position will be responsible for helping to coordinate volunteers, and liaising with community experts to ensure that their digital literacy ideas and concepts are considered. This position will also require assistance with the evaluation of the digital literacy training throughout the program. The ideal candidate will be flexible, forward-thinking, and have an understanding of marginalized and vulnerable learners and excellent English language skills. They must have a good understanding of digital literacy issues, particularly for vulnerable populations, and an expertise in the pedagogical practices of adult education.
